collaborative action to address societal issues. Michigan State University, the University of Kansas, and the University of Minnesota are strategic partners for the initiative, providing critical leadership and in-kind and financial support. Selected ESI cohort members will commit to an ongoing learning and leadership experience from May 2019 to August 2020. This experience includes a combination of in-person and virtual meetings, mentoring, and collaborative scholarly work.
