GRADUATE LEVEL STATUS

If you do not have a copy of your SAR, you may contact the federal processing center and request a duplicate by calling 1-800-433-3243.

If you have a pin number, you may make the corrections on the FAFSA website. In order to make the correction on the internet go to the website www.fafsa.ed.gov. If your parents do not have a pin number, please be sure to print a signature page that your parents may sign and send to the processing center. For both correction methods be sure to change question #49 to no and add parent information. Be sure the parent has signed if using the paper SAR or used a pin number or signature page if corrected on the FAFSA website.
