ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

- Develop and teach required and elective didactic courses in the social and administrative sciences; this includes courses dealing with the substance, methods and application of various disciplines.
- Establish a scholarly research focus and engage in research and other scholarly endeavors that result in peer-reviewed publications.
- Collaborate in the scholarly endeavors of other faculty and students.
- Perform academic and professional service to advance the college, university, the profession of pharmacy and the community.
- Participate in the governance of department, college and university.
- Advise students enrolled in academic programs.
- Engage in other duties of full-time faculty members as specified in the Faculty Handbook and Academic Charter.

Comments: The faculty member in Social and Administrative Pharmacy is responsible for the development and implementation of teaching and research programs that explore the systematic means of ensuring optimal drug use. Collaborative teaching and scholarship with other Drake faculty and students, including fellow colleagues in the Pharmacy Practice department is expected. Applicants should seek to achieve scholarship in all areas of performance and have interests in teaching and innovative educational programs, discovery of knowledge in their specialty area, advising and service. This is a calendar year (12 month), tenure-track position. A Ph.D. degree in Social and Administrative Pharmacy or a related social science or health discipline is preferred; advanced ABD's will be considered. Preference given to candidates with research and teaching interests in the social and behavioral sciences, as well as candidates who have a professional pharmacy degree (PharmD or BS). Salary is competitive and dependent on qualifications and experience.

ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS

EDUCATION: PHD DEGREE IN SOCIAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE PHARMACY (PHARMACY ADMINISTRATION) OR A RELATED SOCIAL SCIENCE OR HEALTH DISCIPLINE IS PREFERRED; ADVANCED ABD'S WILL BE CONSIDERED. PREFERENCE WILL BE GIVEN TO CANDIDATES WITH RESEARCH AND TEACHING INTERESTS IN THE SOCIAL AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES, AS WELL AS CANDIDATES WHO HAVE A PROFESSIONAL PHARMACY DEGREE (PHARM D OR BS).

EXPERIENCE: TEACHING AND RESEARCH EXPERIENCE IN THE CANDIDATE'S CHOSEN DISCIPLINE IS PREFERRED.

OTHER ESSENTIAL TRAINING AND SKILLS: A commitment to academic excellence; good interpersonal, oral and written communication skills; ability to collaborate with fellow faculty; and ability to perform scholarly and instructional duties as required of faculty.
