

Drake University Summary of 2003-05 NSSE Surveys

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The following pages present tables with summary data for the 2003-2005 National Survey of Student Engagement. Respondent Characteristics are presented first, followed by tables with 2003, 2004 and 2005 scales for First-Year Students and Seniors. The Scale tables compare Drake student responses with those for students from all Masters institutions. Drake's percentile rank indicates the percent of all Masters institutions that had scores below Drake's on the scale.

The next section presents scale component items for each scale for 2003, 2004 and 2005 for first-year students then for seniors.. The level of significance, (extent to which Drake score is higher or lower than other Masters institutions) is indicated as follows:

- 1 star (*) = .05 level of significance
- 2 stars (**) = .01 level of significance
- 3 stars (***) = .001 level of significance

A plus (+) after the star(s) indicates that Drake's average is significantly higher, while a minus (-) indicates that Drake's score is significantly lower.
