



SUPREME COURT DAY PROBLEM

Mark Baumann was the owner of a group life and accidental death policy issued by Sioux City Mutual Insurance Company. The insurance policy contained an intoxication exclusion that states, in pertinent part, that "no benefit shall be paid for a Loss caused by or resulting from...an injury occurring while the covered person is intoxicated." In the policy, "intoxication" is defined as "that which is determined and defined by the laws and jurisdiction of that geographical area where the loss or cause of loss was incurred." Sioux City Mutual's intoxication exclusion is the subject matter of these proceedings.

On December 4, 1994, Mr. Baumann left his home to meet Ralph Hennesy, a friend with whom he enjoyed watching football, at Pat Flansburg's Sports Bar. Mr. Baumann was at Pat Flansburg's for approximately four (4) hours, during which time he consumed alcoholic beverages. At approximately 11:00 p.m., Mark Baumann decided to walk, instead of drive, home, because he had strong convictions about drinking and driving. Mr. Baumann's home was only a 15-minute walk from Pat Flansburg's, just across the North Raccoon River. On his way home, Mr. Baumann fell from the bank of the North Raccoon River into the river and died. The police deduced that he had apparently walked to the side of the sidewalk because of construction and then fell down the embankment into the river. Mr. Baumann's body was found by the shore of the river at approximately noon on December 5, 1994.

The causes of death listed on the Death Certificate are drowning and exposure, along with a contributing factor of ethanol intoxication. Mark Baumann's postmortem blood-alcohol level was 0.11%.

Following Mr. Baumann's death, a claim was made on the life insurance policy by Plaintiff Angela Baumann, wife of the deceased, for the proceeds of the coverage. Sioux City Mutual denied recovery because of the above-mentioned intoxication exclusion.

Angela Baumann requests that Sioux City Mutual be made to pay the benefits that she believes she deserves under the policy of the deceased.

Sioux City Mutual requests the Court rule that the insurer properly denied payment of benefits to Angela Baumann under the exclusion because intoxication was determined to be a contributing factor in the insured's death.
