

## *Supreme Court Celebration* *Keynote Speaker: Jan Schlichtmann*



Jan R. Schlichtmann is one of the country's most notable plaintiff's attorneys. Mr. Schlichtmann specializes in the area of complex civil litigation, including consumer, environmental, product, toxic, and mass tort litigation. In 1973, Mr. Schlichtmann graduated Phi Beta Kappa from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst and in 1977 earned his

law degree from Cornell. While at law school, he clerked for the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee and after graduation joined the staff of the U.S. House Special Select Committee on Assassinations as special counsel. In 1978, Mr. Schlichtmann entered private practice in Massachusetts as a trial lawyer and earned recognition for obtaining some of that state's highest verdicts and settlements in civil torts.

In 1986, Mr. Schlichtmann received national recognition for his representation of eight Woburn, Massachusetts families against W.R. Grace and Beatrice Foods for the contamination of the Woburn City water supply. The groundbreaking nature of the Woburn case and Mr. Schlichtmann's work in it has been the subject of a number of national and international television and radio shows, press reports, and magazine stories, including "60 Minutes" and "Nova," as well as articles in legal and scientific journals and books. Mr. Schlichtmann's career and involvement in the Woburn case was chronicled in the national bestseller, "A Civil Action" that became a major motion picture starring John Travolta as Mr. Schlichtmann. More recently, Mr. Schlichtmann founded and is currently a host for The Legal Broadcast Network, [www.legalbroadcastnetwork.com](http://www.legalbroadcastnetwork.com), a virtual marketplace for resources and live internet radio programming on critical legal issues. LBN is a dynamic

and powerful communication tool for the legal community and those interested in the work of trial lawyers.

Mr. Schlichtmann has served on the faculty of the New England School of Law and Suffolk Law School's continuing legal education program, and has been on the faculty of the National Judicial College in Reno, Nevada. He has lectured at many of the nation's law schools and colleges and has spoken before numerous national and regional professional and civic groups, has appeared on a number of the country's major radio and television shows, and has participated in an array of public forums on issues of law, public policy and the environment. In addition, Mr. Schlichtmann has consulted with and testified before several governmental agencies and legislative committees on issues of toxic waste liability and the civil justice system.

In 1990, Mr. Schlichtmann, as a member of a special legislatively mandated committee, helped author a complete revision of the Massachusetts Hazardous Waste Cleanup Statute which was enacted into law July of 1992. Martindale-Hubbell Law Directory has accorded Mr. Schlichtmann its highest ratings for both legal ability ("A" preeminent) and general recommendation of the bar and judiciary ("V" very high). Mr. Schlichtmann has been listed in "The Best Lawyers in America."

## *The Supreme Court Day Competition*

Each year, the finest advocates in the law school compete in the Supreme Court Day Competition for the honor of presenting the final oral arguments to the Iowa Supreme Court. The problem is based upon a real case, using an actual record that was pending before the Iowa Supreme Court. Thus, competitors are truly afforded a simulation of an appellate case.

The competition is open to all second and third year Drake Law students. Competitors must submit a written brief and participate in two preliminary rounds of oral arguments, one on-brief and one off-brief. Each competitor argues individually in the preliminary rounds, with 15 minutes of time allocated to each advocate. The top four oral advocates, based upon scores from the preliminary rounds, advance to the Supreme Court Day argument before the Iowa Supreme Court. The four finalists are paired as teams of two for the final round, with each advocate arguing for 10 minutes. The award for the Best Oralist in the final round is announced each year at the Supreme Court Day Banquet.

## *A Brief Summary of the 2005 Supreme Court Day Problem*

The Appellant, Dr. Margaret Peterson, appeals an Iowa District Court Order that dismissed her child custody claims for lack of jurisdiction. Appellant was born and raised in Iowa. She received her veterinary degree in Iowa and then moved to New Jersey to practice. Appellee, Mr. Robert Davis, is a lifetime New Jersey resident. He currently owns a hotel and other investment properties in New Jersey. The parties met in New Jersey in 2000 and by 2001, they were living together and engaged to be married. In 2002, Appellant became pregnant after undergoing fertility treatment. Several weeks before the child was due, Appellant returned to

Iowa. On July 4, 2003, Jennifer Peterson was born in Iowa to Appellant and Appellee.

The Appellee initiated proceedings in the Superior Court of New Jersey on July 18, 2003, filing a Petition for Child Custody and a Motion to Compel Plaintiff to return to New Jersey with the child. On July 29, 2003, Appellant filed a similar petition in the District Court of Iowa, seeking to establish paternity, physical care, child custody, visitation, child support and medical support. On August 7, 2003, Appellant also initiated a domestic abuse suit against Appellee. On August 26, 2003, Appellee moved to dismiss the claims for lack of subject matter jurisdiction because of the pending New Jersey suit. Once the District Court of Iowa heard oral arguments on the issue, the court entered a Judgment of Dismissal and an Order Finding Lack of Jurisdiction Regarding Child Custody Issues. The court held both the Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction Act of Iowa (UCCJA) the Federal Parental Kidnapping Act (FPKA) required New Jersey be declared the child's home state as Appellant expressed an intention to return to New Jersey. Further, the Iowa District Court declined to exercise jurisdiction over the matter, finding that Iowa was an inconvenient forum.

Appellant now appeals the district court's dismissal of the claims that was based upon the ruling that New Jersey is the home state of the child. The issue is whether the child's home state is Iowa, where Appellant gave birth to the child and has continued to reside, or whether the home state is New Jersey, as Appellant's residence in Iowa is temporary. Further, Appellant contends that even if New Jersey is the home state, the District Court of Iowa may exercise jurisdiction over the matter as Iowa is a more convenient forum. The court must determine whether the Iowa UCCJA and the FPKA allow Iowa to retain jurisdiction or whether Iowa must defer to New Jersey.
