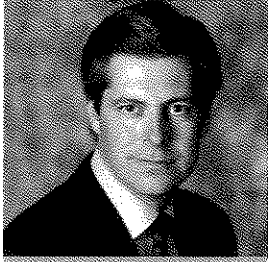

KEYNOTE SPEAKER
Justin Webb

Justin Webb is BBC Radio's chief Washington correspondent. He is also a television anchor — currently seen in the U.S. on the evening “BBC World News” on public television.

Before coming to Washington, Webb spent three years as the BBC's Europe correspondent, based in Brussels, Belgium. Prior to that he was a BBC anchor based in London. For three years he was the main anchor of the morning television news show “Breakfast News” and also presented the evening six o'clock news. During that time he interviewed many senior politicians and two prime ministers, John Major and Tony Blair.

Webb's career includes stints as a roving foreign correspondent during which he reported from the first Gulf War, the war in Bosnia, the collapse of the Soviet Union, the first democratic elections in South Africa, and even a coup in the Maldiv Islands. His first job in the BBC was Radio Ulster, based in Belfast, Ireland.

He was educated at Friends' School Sidcot and the London School of Economics from which he graduated in 1983 with an honors degree in economics.

The Supreme Court Competition

Each year, the finest advocates in the Drake Law School compete in the Supreme Court Competition for the honor of presenting final oral arguments to the Iowa Supreme Court. The problem is based upon a real case, using an actual record that was pending before the Iowa Supreme Court, thus giving competitors a realistic experience.

The competition is open to all second and third year Drake Law students and consists of two preliminary rounds, one on-brief and one off-brief. Each competitor argues individually in the preliminary rounds, with 15 minutes of time allocated to each advocate. The top four oral advocates, based upon scores from the preliminary rounds, advance to the Supreme Court Competition before the Iowa Supreme Court. The four finalists are paired as teams of two for the final round, with each arguing for 10 minutes. The award for the best oralist in the final round is announced at the Supreme Court Celebration Banquet.

A Brief Summary of the 2006 Supreme Court Competition Problem

The appellant, Joe Ryan, appeals an Iowa District Court order that provided for inpatient commitment and the involuntary administration of psychotropic drugs.

Appellant is a 35-year-old male who suffers from paranoid schizophrenia. He is able to live on his own. On April 27, 2004, appellant's mother filed an application alleging serious mental impairment against appellant pursuant to Iowa Code §229.6. His mother alleged that appellant had a serious mental impairment and posed a danger to himself or others. The application further requested that appellant be taken into immediate custody and involuntarily committed to a medical facility for evaluation and treatment. The judge found that there was probable cause to believe appellant was seriously mentally impaired and a danger to himself or others if allowed to remain at liberty. Appellant was taken into custody and committed to a nearby medical facility.

A hearing on the application alleging serious mental impairment was held before a county magistrate judge. Appellant's parents both testified at the hearing, along with the doctor charged with appellant's care. Appellant contends that he is not mentally ill, and he has refused to take his medication. The doctor recommended that the court involuntarily commit appellant for inpatient mental health treatment.

No other witnesses besides appellant's parents testified that he is a danger to himself and others. Appellant's attorney moved to dismiss the application on grounds that there was not clear and convincing evidence to support a finding that appellant was a danger to himself or others. Despite the motion to dismiss, the magistrate ordered involuntary commitment, which included intramuscular injection of long-lasting psychotropic drugs.

Appellant then appealed the commitment order to the District Court. Once again, appellant's doctor testified at the proceedings regarding appellant's condition. The District Court continued the involuntary commitment order, but modified it to move appellant from inpatient to outpatient commitment. The involuntary commitment order was continued, however, appellant was moved from an inpatient commitment to an outpatient commitment. The court further ordered appellant to receive forcible intramuscular injections of psychotropic drugs.

Appellant now appeals the district court's commitment order to the Iowa Supreme Court. The issues are the following: whether appellant satisfies the requirements under the Iowa Code for commitment based upon limited testimony; and whether appellant's due process rights were violated through the administration of psychotropic drugs.
