Keynote Speaker 2009 Alumnus of the Year Stephen Rapp

Stephen Rapp currently serves as prosecutor of the Special Court for Sierra Leone. During this term he has been tasked with completing the prosecution of the individuals who are alleged to bear the greatest responsibility for the violations of international humanitarian law committed in Sierra Leone between 1996 and 2002. All of these individuals are tried in courtrooms of the SCSL in Freetown, Sierra Leone, except for former Liberian President Charles Taylor, whose trial is being conducted by the SCSL at the venue of the International Criminal Court in The Hague, Netherlands. Prior to joining the SCSL, Rapp was chief of prosecutions at the United Nations-International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda, a position he took in May 2005. Prior to his service at the ICTR, Rapp was United States Attorney for the Northern District of Iowa. He was appointed to this position by President Clinton in November 1993 and confirmed by the U.S. Senate. Rapp is a native of Cedar Falls, IA. He attended local public schools and graduated from Cedar Falls High School. Rapp received his BA degree with honors from Harvard University in government and international relations. He attended Columbia Law School and received his JD degree with honors from Drake University.



2009 Alumna of the Year Sheila Tipton

Sheila Tipton is a shareholder with the firm of Belin Lamson Zumbach McCormick Flynn, a professional corporation, practicing in the areas of corporate law, administrative law, employment and public utilities law. including energy, telecommunications and water law. She has been active in the Polk County Bar Association, the Iowa State Bar Association and the Federal Energy Bar Association. She is a frequent author and lecturer in her areas of expertise, especially public utilities and energy, including electric, natural gas, wind and nuclear. She has been listed in The Best Lawyers in America each year since 1992 in environmental, energy and natural resources law. She has served on the board of and has been president of the Legal Aid Society of Polk County, the Rotary Club of Des Moines, and the Des Moines Metropolitan Opera. Tipton has also been a board member of Youth Homes of Mid-America. In 1997, she received the Governor's Volunteer Award. In addition to serving on the Board of Counselors, she and her husband, Bill Dawe, who is also one of our alumni, are members of the Leland S. Forrest Society in their support of the Law School Annual Fund.

The Supreme Court Competition

Each year, outstanding advocates in the Law School compete in the Supreme Court Competition for the honor of presenting final arguments to the Iowa Supreme Court. The problem is based upon a real case, using an actual record that was pending before the Iowa Supreme Court, thus giving competitors a realistic experience.

The competition is open to all second and third year law students and consists of writing a brief and two preliminary rounds, one on-brief and one off-brief. Each competitor argues individually in the preliminary rounds, with 10 minutes of time allocated to each advocate. The four top advocates based upon scores from the preliminary rounds advance to the Supreme Court Competition before the lowa Supreme Court. The four finalists are usually paired as teams of two for the final round, each arguing for 10 minutes. The award for the Best Oralist in the final round is then announced at the Supreme Court Celebration Banquet.

A Brief Summary of the 2009 Supreme Court Competition Problem

SMART SEED CO., PETITIONER V. NOTHERN SEED GENETICS, JOHNSON, HAWK, & SMITH RESPONDENTS

The case asks the lowa Supreme Court to determine whether an affirmative claim for breach of a duty of loyalty exists and whether it is available absent a fiduciary relationship. Smart Seed alleges that Defendants Johnson, Hawk and Smith violated their duty of loyalty by encouraging fellow employees to seek employment at a competitor. Defendants contend that they owed no duty of loyalty to Smart Seed because they were not fiduciaries and lowa has not recognized an independent claim for breach of loyalty.

IOWA SUPREME COURT WRITING COMPETITION AWARDS

The Third Annual Drake University Law School Writing Competition problem asked students to evaluate the Postville raids. Students were specifically encouraged to address the government's decision to criminally prosecute undocumented aliens working in the Agriprocessors, Postville meat-processing plant. The competition is a collaboration between the Law School faculty, the Iowa Supreme Court, and the Iowa Bar Association. Student entries are evaluated by members of the Law School faculty, who select the five finalists. The first and second place awards are determined by the Iowa Supreme Court, who evaluate the five finalist entries. The first place entry receives, in addition to a generous cash award, publication in the Iowa Bar Association's monthly bar journal, The Iowa Lavyer.
