Student Practice License Without Academic Credit (Summer Only)

In order to be eligible for a student practice license under lowa Court Rule 31.15 (3), students must be a part of an "educational program" of the law school. We have interpreted this to require that a student enroll in an internship for academic credit along with the non-credit bearing Internship Seminar.

Students interested in receiving their student practice license during the summer may do so by enrolling in the zero-credit internship seminar, at no tuition cost, if they meet the following criteria:

- They are enrolling for an internship for a summer term
- Student does not require credits to remain on track for graduation
- Students must complete the Student Practice without Academic Credit form (below)
- They are interning at a non-profit or government agency
- Their internship requires a student practice license
- Students complete the internship agreement indicating the number of hours of work expected by their site supervisor. Students agree to complete their hours as agreed.
- They agree to fully participate in the Internship Seminar. This includes attending all sessions, turning in all course work, and logging internship hours as directed the Professor.
