Report Overview

Student Dispositions

The Counseling Program began measuring and monitoring student dispositions in 2015 tracking six different dispositions across different classes. A complex matrix noted which disposition was measured in each class. The program sought to simplify and focus the disposition evaluation system. The faculty were also concerned about cultural implications of some of the previous dispositions. Specifically, *professionalism*, which was defined as 'attire fitting to setting', has been described as a social construct that reinforces oppression, particularly sexism, racism, and classism (Gray, 2019; Manthey, 2017; Negrete-Lopez et al., 2020; Rios, 2015). The review resulted in a new evaluation system of three dispositions, described below, which are rated by all instructors at the conclusion of each course. This process provides consistent and continual evaluation for all students.

Disposition	Description

Students are rated by instructors on a three-point system from 1 deficient, 2 marginal, and 3 meets. Students are then provided feedback through Starfish a campus wide advising platform. In addition to end of course ratings the ongoing surveys from program graduates and site-supervisors as well as annual surveys of employers provide another opportunity to gather information on dispositions. At the program level mean scores for each disposition are monitored across term as well as in courses where the ratings are highest and lowest. The faculty then review and discuss any curricular or program changes that might be undertaken in response to this data. Disposition information is also monitored over time to track any longitudinal changes. The new dispositions were implemented for the fall 2021 term so it will take several semesters before longitudinal data is available.

Highlights from the 2022-2023 Academic Year

- The program is meeting the target performance in 83 out of 88 elements we monitor each year. This
 represents substantial improvement from the previous year when the program was not meeting
 benchmarks for fourteen different monitored elements.
- The program is monitoring an additional three items which are at the threshold for meeting or slightly above the threshold. This approach allows us to potentially address areas of concern before performance drops below expected performance.
- The program evaluation system, revised prior to the 2021-2022 academic year appears to be functioning very well. The faculty are able to monitor all 11 KPIs with actionable data to inform us of areas of concern. The evaluation process facilitates a data driven discussion to allow the faculty to devise and implement program changes with the goal of addressing identified concerns.
- Student performance on all of the metrics in KPI 2, student knowledge of power and privilege in counseling, has been a tremendous accomplishment. Program faculty have worked hard to implement strategies around recognizing and working with many different types of oppression. We have also shifted from a multicultural competence goal to a multicultural and social justice competence framework. These strategies are beginning to show outcomes in this KPI.
- Disposition ratings from faculty demonstrated noticeable growth in the past year. Last year ratings from faculty were closer to 2.5 on average, which was different from student, supervisor, and employer ratings which were in the 2.8-3 range. Ratings in the last year from faculty rose to 2.8-2.9 suggesting more consistency across all raters and improvement with respect to student demonstration of expectations for each of the three dispositions.

Action Items for the 2023-2024 Academic Year

- Program faculty will start working on 2024 standards. In this process COUN 201 research in counseling course standards and assignments will be reviewed and improved
- Program faculty continues to focus on case conceptualization skills. Practicum instructor met with
 Diagnosis and Treatment Planning and Theories and Techniques of Counseling course instructors to
 align expectations regarding case conceptualization. The faculty is considering developing a training
 module that will be available to students earlier in the program, therefore students can integrate the
 skills in multiple courses and are more prepared for Practicum and Internship.
- The Equity and Closing the Gap assignments will be monitored in school counseling specific courses as well as in internship for return to higher levels of student performance.
- Program faculty will work to communicate about expectations for dispositions more frequently so that faculty are more familiar and therefore more consistent in their ratings.
- Program faculty will meet over the summer 2023 term to continue to review and devise strategies to address concerns in the career development KPI 4 as well as KPI 8 related to critique and utilization of research.
- The Practicum and Internship coordinator will reach out to site supervisors and employers to explore their specific expectations with respect to career development and career counseling so expectations can be integrated into program instruction.
