

INTEGRITY OF ITS CO-CURRICULAR AND AUXILIARY ACTIVITIES

In addition to programs cited in Criterion 1e, the following provide illustrations of Drake University programs with academic and co-curricular linkages.

- The **Honors Program**, with supervision from the Honors Program staff, is guided by a very active **Student Council**, consisting of members of the Honors student body with responsibility for planning a wide array of academic, co-curricular, and community service activities for members of the program as well as the entire University.
- The **Center for Global Citizenship**, and its **Global Ambassador Program**, combine academic and co-curricular experiences. An external advisory committee, providing frequent feedback and support for program development, ensures the program's connection to institutional goals.
- The **International Center**, including **Study Abroad Programs**, reports to the Provost and collaborates with the Center for Global Citizenship and the Drake University Language Acquisition Program (DULAP) to better coordinate and support responsible global citizenship initiatives.
- The **Don V. Adams Leadership Institute** is advised by a steering committee with membership that includes alumni, provost, dean of students, director of marketing and communications, and assistant vice president for alumni and development.
- **Greek Life**—Roughly 25% of Drake University undergraduates are members of social sororities and fraternities, and the Greek system is a valued component of the institution's fabric. Members of Greek organizations are well represented in campus leadership positions, and they are major contributors to a variety of on- and off-campus service activities. Greek Life is overseen by a Greek life coordinator (who reports to the dean of students), supported by the Pan-Hellenic Council, Inter-Fraternity Council, and the National Pan-Hellenic Council.
- **Athletics**—Drake University prides itself on our aspiration to be a national model for integrity in intercollegiate athletics, and in the integration of academic and athletic excellence. The integrity of athletics is overseen ultimately by the President, to whom the athletic director reports, and this oversight is strengthened by a strong structural and operational relationship between the athletic director and her staff on the one hand, and the provost and his staff on the other.
- **Drake University Recreational Services** strives to enrich the quality of campus life by promoting and offering opportunities for physical, mental, social interaction and growth in healthy surroundings and superior recreational facilities. Recreational Services' innovative programs and offerings serve to provide a connecting link between students and the University experience. Input and evaluation of services from faculty, staff, and students is integral to the planning process, under the direction and guidance of the athletic director and associate athletic direction for recreation services.

- **Auxiliary Services** – Food service, facilities, residence halls, and parking are examples of contracted services at Drake University. The Vice President for Business and Finance provides oversight for auxiliary services and in consultation with managers and respective corporate office representatives, determines improvement opportunities based on results from annual satisfaction surveys of students, staff, and faculty.
