 - a. Minutes approved unanimously
- 2. Report from the Dean
 - a. New look to website will be introduced in January
 - i. Start with front pages, will eventually change department pages
 - b. Communications will be going through admissions materials-creating program information, similar to Data Analytics/Kinesiology
 - c. SJMC master's program is going online w/4 different tracks
 - d. FY18 budget prep is underway-how to move/save money-preparing for January BOT meeting
- 3. Report from Student Senator
 - a. Ben is working on A&S Facebook page-trying to get more students to join
 - b. Elizabeth is creating monthly music events in Pomerantz Stage
- 4. Report from Faculty Senate
 - a. Small change: added a student to the Drake Curriculum Committee
 - b. Big changes:
 - i. Sanctuary Campus-recommended that Drake declare itself a sanctuary campus to do everything we can to not disclose a student's immigration status
 - 1. Concerns about Federal Aid repercussions-shouldn't effect
 - Symbolic effort or not-students understand can't do everything, but will try
 - ii. Curriculum Outcomes-updated diversity statements, will be proposing curriculum changes to match

 - 2. End of Semester event-combined with Provost event-have mentors introduce them to people
 - 3. January workshop-timeline is ambiguous

 - 5. Send invite to help w/workshop and keep track of program to assess it

 - 1. Selectivity-not clear that not to describe everything for a class
 - 2. What was the basis for this?
 - ii. Operating Procedures
 - 1. Do not like #2 where people in a similar department can review for P&T
 - a. Have a 7th member of P&T for these situations
 - b. Creates an advantage/disadvantage
 - c. Have already reviewed them as the years progress
 - iii. Dean's Presence: to discuss if necessary
 - 1. Only college where their presence is required.
 - a. Valuable to hear every word spoken
 - b. Would it cause freer conversations if the Dean wasn't there?
 - 2. Needs university consistency
 - iv. Timeline: input now, December break make adjustments, early Spring-town hall meeting, then to Council for approval, then vote by faculty
