

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To be considered for admission to the professional OTD program, the following requirements must be completed by the end of the third year of pre-OT unless otherwise indicated:

- + Earn a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher, as calculated in OTCAS.
- + Complete and pass all required prerequisite pre-OT coursework. Courses may be repeated one time by the end of the summer term prior to enrollment in the professional program (Drake course numbers):
 - Anatomy and Physiology with labs, 8 cr. (HSCI 141/L, HSCI 125/L, PHAR 125, BIO 018/L, BIO 129/L)
 - General Psychology, 3 cr. (PSY 001, 4 cr.)
 - Developmental Psychology, 3 cr. (HSCI 146, PSY 041, PSY 042, PSY 044)
 - Abnormal Psychology, 3 cr. (PSY 076)
 - Social Science Elective, 3 cr. (approved course in ECON, PSY, SOC, and other social sciences)
 - Statistics, 3 cr. (HSCI 060, BIO 140, PSY 011)
 - Medical Terminology, 1 cr. (HSCI 095)
 - Writing/English Composition, 6 cr. (WRIT AOI, FYS)
 - Public Speaking, 3 cr. (ENG 063)
- + Successfully complete all other degree requirements, as specified by the program of study within the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences or the College of Arts and Sciences
- + Complete at least three years of undergraduate coursework (approximately 92 credit hours) by the end of the summer term prior to enrollment in the professional program, enroll in a minimum of 12 credit hours at Drake University each semester, and remain in good standing with the University.

Drake pre-occupational therapy students have a guaranteed seat in the Occupational Therapy Doctorate program, provided they meet the admission requirements.

Applicants will be evaluated on the content and quality of all items listed below:

- + Completed and submitted OTCAS application with fees
- + Academic performance and strength of prerequisite and overall coursework. Students offered final admission may have GPAs much higher than the minimums.
- + Admission interview

Students who do not meet priority application deadlines or do not complete the admission interview when scheduled may have their application review delayed.
