# <u>Drake Direct PharmD</u> <u>Admission Program</u>

## A true 2 + 4 pharmacy program

To be considered for admission to the professional program, the following requirements must be completed by the end of the second year of pre-pharmacy unless otherwise indicated:

- + No minimum GPA is required, although 3.0 overall GPA (as calculated by either Drake or PharmCAS) is considered competitive.
- Complete and pass all required prerequisite pre-pharmacy coursework (Drake course numbers):
  - General (Inorganic) Chemistry with labs, 8 cr. (CHEM 001/003, CHEM 002/004)
  - Organic Chemistry with labs, 8 cr. (CHEM 097/098, CHEM 108/110)
  - Biological Sciences with labs, 8 cr., must include topics in human anatomy (BIO 012/L, HSCI 141/L)
  - Microbiology, 3 cr. (BIO 095)
  - Statistics, 3 cr. (STAT 060 or HSCI 060)
  - Calculus, 3 cr. (MATH 050)
  - Writing/English Composition, 6 cr. (WRIT AOI, FYS)
  - Public Speaking, 3 cr. (ENG 037)
- + Successfully complete PHAR 011, 031, 051, 071.
- + Complete at least 2 years of undergraduate coursework (approximately 62 credit hours) by the end of the summer term prior to enrollment in the professional program, enroll in a minimum of 12 credit hours at Drake University each semester, and remain in good standing with the University.

Drake pre-pharmacy students have a guaranteed seat in the Doctor of Pharmacy program, provided they meet the admission requirements.

#### Applicants will be evaluated on the content and quality of all items listed below:

- + Application materials submitted by the designated due date in the second pre-pharmacy year.
- + Academic performance and strength of prerequisite and overall coursework.
- + Admission interview.

Students who do not meet application deadlines or do not complete the admission interview when scheduled may have their application review delayed.
