2025 Weaver Medal of Honor Recipient & Lecturer

Carl Jakopec, Illinois native, developed an interest in pharmacy at age 16 during his first job at a local pharmacy. He earned his Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy from Drake in 1969, where he was active In Kappa Psi. He spent eight years as a pharmacy manager for Walgreens in Des Moines before moving to Colorado, where he owned two pharmacies and consulted for the largest nursing home in the state. In early 1981, he entered the pharmaceutical industry with Marion Laboratories as a speciality sales representative. During this time, he was asked to serve on the First National Commission on the Future of Drake University, and later the first National Advisory Council of CPHS. After a short stint with a startup wound care company in Topeka, KS, he joined Forest Laboratories, Inc. as Director of Government Affairs and Sales in 1996.

In his time there, he developed Forest's entry into sales, working with several federal healthcare entities. Up until his retirement in 2014, he was active in the Association of Military Surgeons of the United States and their Sustaining Members. While a member, he mentored new representatives from other companies about federal purchasing. He also served a term as President of the Sustaining Members. Jakopec moved to Las Vegas in 1999 and was active in motorsports and his grandson's hockey. He currently spends four days a week at the golf course.
