

I'm Getting a Haircut

I go to the hair salon. There is somebody at the front desk. I will tell them my name.



I might have to wait before I get my hair cut. There might be other people waiting, too.

When it is my turn, the hairstylist will say my name and take me to a chair. There are a lot of chairs sitting in a row.

When the hairstylist is done cutting my hair, they may ask me if I want my hair styled. I can say yes or no.



When the hairstylist is all done, they will take off my cape. I can get out of my chair. I say thank you to my hairstylist for my haircut. I look good!
