Program Notes:

General Education Electives: Students who do not meet the General Education Articulation Agreement must complete the <u>Drake Curriculum</u> general education requirements (Areas of Inquiry) and other general elective credits for a total of 26 credits. Area of Inquiry (AOI) courses not fulfilled by curricular requirements are: Artistic Literacy, Global and Cultural Understanding, and Historical Foundations (9 credits).

Pharmacy Professional Electives: Five (5) credits are required and completed during the professional program.

Professional Electives Policy: Professional electives provide the student with an opportunity to not only pursue areas of intellectual interest, but also to develop an individual "brand" that may benefit them in their professional or academic future. Professional electives should (a) expand upon information presented in the standard curriculum, (b) introduce new information that is relevant to the field of study, (c) or prepare the student for graduate study. Professional electives must be CPHS-labeled courses, those indicated on approved curriculum guides, or courses otherwise approved by the College's Academic Affairs Committee (AAC). Any professional elective must be numbered 100-level or higher for graduate and doctoral-level programs. Other courses (even if taught by CPHS faculty) are not considered professional electives except with an approved Exception to Program Policy (request form available on the CPHS Forms Library). Students should review the <u>student handbook</u> for the complete professional elective policy.
