During my time at Drake, I have been involved in public interest environmental work, which has benefited my teaching and has given Drake law students a tremendous opportunity to gain valuable environmental law experience. Among the cases in which I have participated:

- Appointed as arbitrator for groundwater contamination case seeking \$12 million in damages.
- Represented citizens group in water quality suit against EPA; three-year litigation effort resulted in consent decree requiring cleanup plans for 189 impaired waters in Iowa.
- Represented citizen's group challenging issuance of permit to meat-packing plant which discharged pollutants into high quality trout stream. Suit resulted in modified permit limits and \$600,000 penalty.
- Represented Linn County Conservation Board in challenge to highway that will adversely impact one of last native sand prairie habitats in Iowa.
- Represented City of Norwalk in 8th Circuit lawsuit involving noise and other environmental impacts of airport runway extension
- Expert witness and consultant in two major land use cases in Iowa: *QRS v. City of Spencer* (Iowa 1996) and *Iowa Coal Mining Co. v. Monroe County* (Iowa 1994).
- Along with Professor Greg Sisk, I submitted an amicus brief in *Atchison, Topeka, and Santa Fe Ry. Co. v. Brown & Bryant, Inc.*, 159 F.3d 358 (9th Cir. 1997). Our brief became the basis for the court's decision in the case, which decided an important issue regarding successor liability under CERCLA.
