Public Service Loan Forgiveness Employment Certification

The Iowa State Public Defender's office is now able to begin certifying employment for contract attorneys for the purposes of obtaining loan forgiveness through the Federal Public Service Student Loan Forgiveness Program. This certification is retroactive to the program's initiation in October 2007.

Contagious Illness Protocols

Students are to follow CDC protocols applicable to any instance in which a student is contagious with a viral or bacterial infection, such as influenza, strep, mononucleosis, or COVID-19. Although reporting is no longer required, infectious students cannot attend in-person classes and must contact their instructors to coordinate making up any missed material. Faculty may use their own discretion for how to treat absences due to illness.
