## ESL Professional Development Partnership

Scholarship funds are provided by Heartland AEA for educators to take coursework designed to improve their effectiveness in teaching and assessing English Learners, with course costs reimbursed after each course is passed. Interested teachers can complete the entire endorsement if they wish, though they are not required to (courses listed below – currently costing \$1500 + \$60 tech fee per course).



\$5400 scholarships are available to all teachers served by Heartland AEA’s Title III funding stream. These funds can be spent across two academic years (2019-2020 and 2020-2021).
