Requirements for the History Major (students entering in August 2019 and thereafter)

Students must earn 39 credit hours in History to graduate with a History major. Students may also apply up to 12 credit hours from a second major toward a History double major. In this 27 + 12 Track, students complete a minimum of 27 credit hours in History and 12 credit hours (100+ level) in a single related major approved by their advisor. Courses from the related double major should be numbered 100 level or above. See also www.drake.edu/history/.

Beyond the required coursework for the major, students choose their remaining courses (column at right) as history electives for both the traditional 39 credit major and the 27 + 12 track. This allows them to design their major based on their historical interests and professional aspirations.

General Graduation Requirements

In addition to completing requirements for the major and the Drake Curriculum or honors program, students also must complete 40 hours of 100+ level coursework.
