Examples of ways your organization can engage students in the pathways

COMMUNITY ENGAGED LEARNING & RESEARCH

Conduct interviews or surveys; gather, analyze and report research data; design curriculum for training programs or community education.

DIRECT SERVICE

Students can tutor or mentor, construct a home, serve a meal, pull invasive species and more. Direct service opportunities can be one-time or ongoing.

POLICY & GOVERNANCE

Students can research legislation and policies relevant to your programs and goals; create issue briefs; help with voter registration efforts.

COMMUNITY ORGANIZING & ACTIVISM

Students can create content for your social media that educates the public about your work; create videos and multimedia work to promote your causes; collaborate on art projects that send a message.

PHILANTHROPY

Students can put together donation drives, organize a fundraiser, volunteer at a charity event, contribute to grant-writing.

SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP & CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

Business students can help with market research, project management, data analysis, communications and more.
