The most effective way to resolve your technology and classroom-related issues is to submit requests via the ITS service portal at <u>http://service.drake.edu/its</u>, rather than emailing your campus technician directly. Submitting requests directly helps ensure that

- your issues are resolved quicker by providing relevant information in issue-specific request forms;
- your request gets in the queue of the ITS staff member who is available, which may not be your designated campus technician;
- you are able to keep up to date on the status of your requests.

The service portal is also the best place to find information on service outages, search for Knowledge Base (self-help) articles, and learn about the resources that ITS can provide.

#### Irish Artist Aideen Barry

"Visual Fictions"

#### Sussman Theater: 7:30pm, Wednesday, April 17

How can art activate difficult conversations? A talk by visual Artist Aideen Barry on her works exploring otherness, the uncanny and amnesia. Barry will also discuss the importance of humor and slapstick as a tool to disarm the viewer and to activate conversations around sometimes painful subjects such as mental health and inequality.

Ms. Barry is an Irish visual artist, known for her performance, film, sculpture, drawing, and installation work. Aideen Barry's work manifests in the field of contemporary visual arts, but it is punctuated by references to historical and often forgotten or erased figures from literature. Barry often references artists whose texts depict the personal in a way that is a reflection of her own lived experience.

# "Cultures and Languages Across the Curriculum (CLAC)" Workshop

#### June 17-18, 2019

Cultures and Languages Across the Curriculum (CLAC) is a growing movement that enhances students' abilities to utilize language skills by applying them in other disciplines. The facilitator for the workshop will be H. Stephen Straight, who is professor emeritus of anthropology and of linguistics at Binghamton University, State University of New York.

Fifteen first-time participants will be paid \$300/day for each day of the two-day workshop. Those who then develop a linked course will receive an additional \$500. A light breakfast and lunch will be provided.
