

Advising Corner

- soon as possible. The Dean's office will review students' academic records and make decisions on this semester's academic probations and suspensions before the University closes for the holiday break. Per <u>General Catalog</u>, there are important differences between the marks of Incomplete ("I") and In Progress ("IP"):
 - Incomplete: A mark given when the student hasn't submitted all evidence required for a final grade.

a) The student must arrange, with the instructor, a date by which the student will complete the work. This date must occur before the end of the next semester (excluding summer)—

i.e., an incomplete given in the spring semester must be completed by the end of the subsequent fall semester. b) The instructor enters a grade of incomplete ("I") when submitting grades.

c) The instructor also enters a date by which the work must be completed. If no date is

- entered, the date by which the work is due is the end of the subsequent term (excluding summer terms). d) The instructor also enters a default grade—i.e., the official/unchangeable grade that will
- take effect if the work is not completed by the above schedule. e) Marks of incomplete can be updated (in DUSIS) by the instructor. f) Students with an I, IP, NC, or non-reported grade (NR) in any coursework under consideration are not eligible for either the President's or Dean's List.

the coursework could not be finished during the semester (e.g., internships, practicums, or courses that do not fit the standard academic calendar, fieldwork or research that may take place after the conclusion of the semester, thesis work that extends beyond the semester, or other special situation where coursework extends beyond one semester. a) The grade of "IP" must be changed by the instructor (in DUSIS) by the end of the next semester.

In Progress: Given when special conditions make the grade of Incomplete unrepresentative of the status of the students at the close of the semester—i.e., it is appropriate only when
