

students signed up for A&S majors! This is a huge accomplishment, in any year, but especially this one. The University's EFR goal is 800, and we are currently short of that by about 50 students. The focus is now on preventing melt over the summer, among those who have said they would start at Drake in the fall, and among those who have registered for classes. We are planning to return to campus and begin classes on August 24. The first week of the semester will be online for all classes, to ensure that everyone is safe and healthy, knows where to go and how to participate at a safe social distance. But what about residence halls and gathering places? Classroom COVID capacity? Live performances and choir? Athletic events and science labs? I know you are all planning proactively, and for different scenarios. Thank you! I will keep you posted and will communicate any decisions that are being made asap. And then I watch the news, read the newspaper. The grim news of continuing COVID outbreaks and its disastrous effects on our communities was overshadowed last weekend by reports of social unrest, anger and hurt, triggered by a video showing the horrific death of an

African American man in police custody on a Minneapolis street. It is shocking and painful to see how racial inequalities and hatred still play out and take place right in front of our eyes, in our neighborhoods. We cannot accept intolerance and injustices like this. As educators we must advocate for equality and social justice. Diversity is our strength, and we must speak up where this idea is being violated. Check out Jennifer Harvey's powerful open-ed on the CNN website.
