

As fall classes have begun, it is also time to schedule spring. Please plan on spring semester looking a lot like this fall. We will still have classrooms with adjusted COVID capacities, classes that will be taught in different modalities, students who will attend their classes virtually (for the whole semester or for shorter periods, if required). This time around we know what this looks like, and we can plan ahead. When you submit your spring class schedule by September 18, please include the following information: Modality (face-to-face or remote)

When students register for their spring classes, they will see if a class is going to be offered remote or on-campus and they can choose accordingly. They will also be able to plan their schedules around class times. And finally, by including your requests for special rooms/technology, administrative assistants can put a note for the Registrar's office as they schedule rooms. Not all of the requests can be accommodated, since room capacity is drastically reduced in all rooms. At minimum, a room will be found that can hold half (or a third
