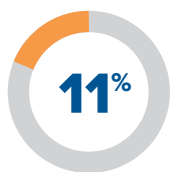

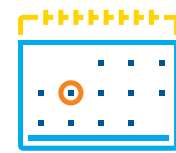

11% of the student population utilized individual counseling services.



2400+ individual appointments were held.



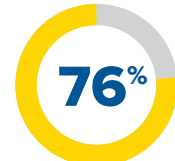
Launched two new programs—**UWILL** and **Collegiate Recovery**—and established a partnership with the Law School.



Trained **115 students, staff and faculty** on **QPR Gatekeeper**, a suicide prevention-based intervention model.



146 events and outreach programs were held.



76% reported improvement in their ability to identify positive and negative mental health patterns as a result of therapy.

Fraternity and Sorority Life

Fraternity and Sorority Life supports the seven Interfraternity Council chapters, five Panhellenic Chapters and nine National Pan-Hellenic Council chapters.

FSL students hold over 180 additional leadership positions on campus outside of their fraternity or sorority.

HIGHER GPA

FSL students, on average, have a higher GPA than their non-Greek affiliated peers.*

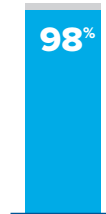
*The overall FSL GPA for Spring semester 2023 was 3.43 compared to the Drake undergraduate GPA which was 3.39.



Approximately 20% of the Drake student body is affiliated with a sorority or fraternity.

Prevention Programs

The Prevention Office worked this year to provide a variety of awareness, educational, and engaging events to positively impact the campus community. Incoming first-years are assigned an online course to prepare them for prevention conversations on campus. **98% of students completed the course.**



ADAMS LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

The Adams Leadership Institute trained a total of **195 student leaders** across **16 workshop series** throughout the 2022-2023 academic year.

Retention

Students who participate in the Adams Leadership Institute are being retained at high rates. The Adams Leadership Institute retention rate has increased from **63% to 89% in the last four years.**
